Flower Show Trip

Kingwood Center is planning a trip to the Philadelphia International Flower Show, Longwood Gardens and Winterthur Museum and Gardens, March 5 to 8. This show is the largest indoor flower show in the world. The show includes ten acres of lush gardens, horticultural specimens, floral designs, room and table settings, displays by plant societies, lectures and demonstrations, and a large sales area. The theme for the flower show is "Hawaii: Islands of Aloha". Native and tropical plants will rise in a living wall amid cascades of orchids and thundering waterfalls. Hula dancers, torch twirlers and 3-D images of crashing waves and rumbling volcanoes will honor Pele, The Goddess of Fire.

Wednesday morning we will visit Longwood Gardens. The Gardens and five acre conservatory are one of the finest gardens in the world. The highlight of the tour will be the "Orchid Extravaganza". In the conservatory thousands of orchid blooms will cascade down walls, spill from containers, and adorn planting beds throughout the sixteen spectacular gardens in full fragrant bloom. Weather permitting, we will also tour the grounds. Wednesday afternoon we will visit Winterthur Museum and Gardens which is known for its magnificent collection of American furniture and decorative arts. Lunch will be in their restaurant prior to the tour. On Thursday will begin our trip back to Mansfield with an estimated arrival time around 6:30 PM. Cost includes dinner Monday, breakfast each morning in the hotel and lunch at Winterthur. We will be staying at the Concordville Hotel and Conference Center. They have a fitness center and indoor pool. The cost is \$625 for Longwood members and \$650 for nonmembers. There is also a \$165 single supplement charge.
