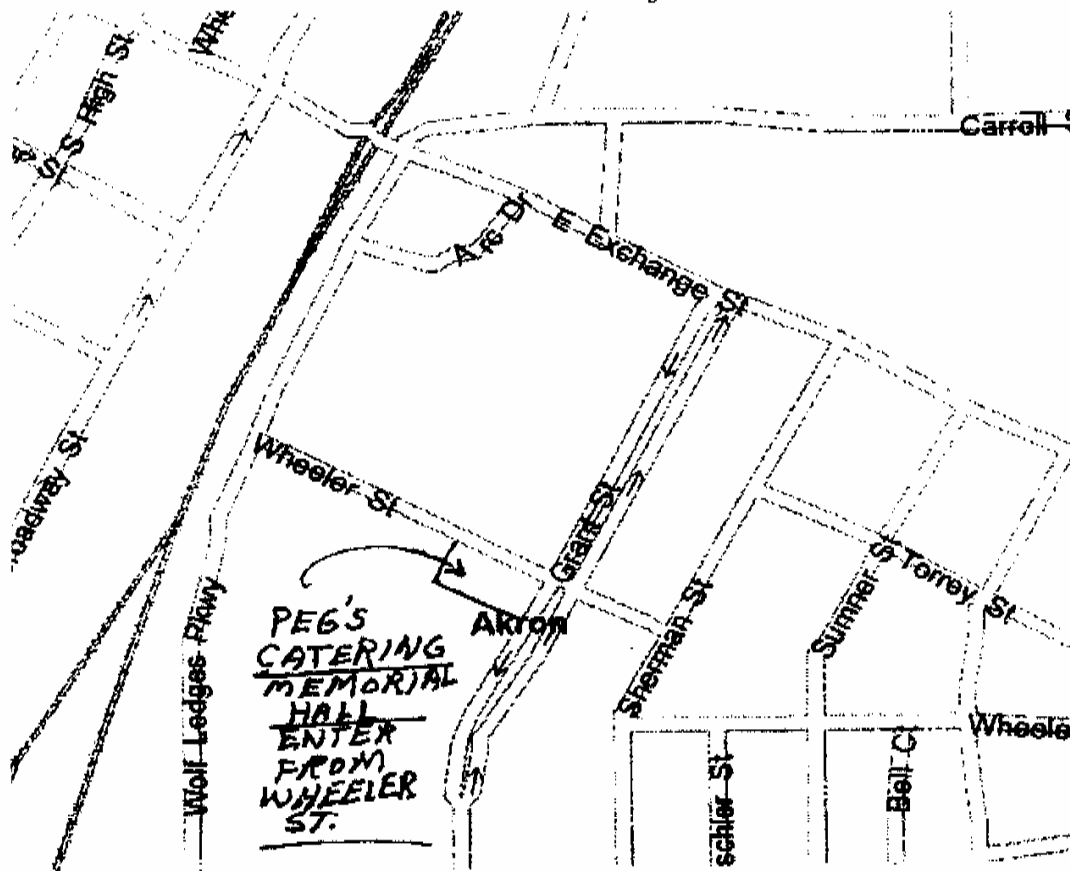
We also want you to attend the meeting to cast your vote for our new dinner location. Many of you visited the Woman's City Club in August, and now you need to see what Peg's has to offer.

National's Financial Statement

Some of you have questioned about the finances of our national and regional organizations. In other words - What are they doing with all the money that we send them each year. To answer this question Frank Mitch, our national director, obtained a copy of the national's financial statement, see page 4. Note the size of the projected shortfall for the year 2004, much larger than 2003's shortfall. This would explain the need for the dues increase to \$ 30.00 for regular members. The national gets nothing from life members.

We do not have a financial statement for the Central Great Lakes Region, but I can tell you from my own experience where most of the region's money goes. As the editor of the Johnny Appleseed Broadcaster, the region's newsletter, the money comes to me to cover the printing and mailing of this newsletter. Two of the yearly issues are taken to the regional meetings that are held in Mansfield and distributed to the clubs that are in attendance. Those clubs not in attendance must receive theirs through the mail. If there is a third edition it must be mailed to every club, except ours of course. There is also a small expense for regional meeting for speakers. The region gets \$1,00 from every member.

Scholarships

Each year our club gives two \$1000.00 scholarships to deserving students at the Ohio State University Agricultural Technical Institute in Wooster. Several months back one of these recipients visited our club and thanked us for this scholarship. As i recall, the other recipient had a conflict that evening but sent us a nice thank you note.

As treasurer I hate to spend money but at the urging of Jim Fee, chairman of the scholarship committee, I finally sent the check to the ATI (in time for the beginning of the semester, however). Jim and I both received a thank you note from ATI.

These scholarships are the biggest one item that we, as a local club, spend money on. This money comes from the geranium sale, so if anyone asks you, what does the club do with its money, tell them it goes for scholarships.

Geranium Sale

Speaking of geraniums - at the last board meeting it was decided to have a geranium sale again next year and geraniums will be ordered. We will be ordering fewer than last year and a different mix of colors. Each year we try to learn from the mistakes of the previous year. This year we had too many pink and white ones.

Also the biggest problem of this year's sale was that nobody was in charge. Next year we need to have somebody in charge early so that tickets can be printed and distributed much earlier than they were this year. Therefore, when next year's president calls for a volunteer to head the geranium sale committee step up and volunteer.

The nominating committee, composed of recent past presidents, will soon be looking for officers for next year. If you are asked to serve don't hesitate or make excuses, step up and say yes I'm willing to serve. We need first and second vice presidents.
