From the Board Meeting

Some important business was conducted at the February board meeting. Frank Mitch presented his summary of last year's expenses and a proposed budget for 2007. According to Frank's estimates the club will be about \$2000.00 short of meeting the proposed budget if the club receives the amount of income that is projected. How to meet this projected shortfall was discussed. We need to bring in more new members for one thing. We need to have a better return from the May plant sale than we had last year. After much discussion the budget was accepted.

One item of business affects all of the members. The cost of the dinners was reduced to \$12.00. The reason for this is rather complicated. Most of you did not know that we are charged \$50.00 for the use of the bar at meetings. This does not go to the caterer but to the owner of the building. Peg's Catering used to cover this charge and the present caterer did also last year. But this year he wants us to meet this expense. After much debate it was decided that this charge should not be a part of the cost of dinner. Instead this cost would come out of the club treasury.

The cost of the bar is a rather touchy subject and we have debated this at board meetings in the past. As is the club's policy any member can attend the board meetings and express an opinion. Also all members of the board are open to hearing your opinions on any of the club's business.
